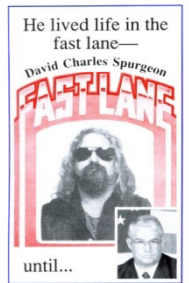

Dear praying friends

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Happy Veteran's Day to all who have served in the military of the United States of America.

We've been busy since the last letter, having preached meetings in three churches in Minnesota, two in Iowa, one in North Dakota, two in Alaska, one in Missouri, two in Colorado and one in Texas. 9 folks made professions of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ for salvation in those meetings, the youngest being 13 years old. Next, Susan and I headed to southern California for a couple of weeks, with three more getting saved. One of them was a 28 year old veteran at the Veteran's Village in San Diego. That was a real blessing. During this last run, Susan spoke to the ladies on seven occasions, as well.

Three days after returning to Dayton, I drove up to Mansfield, Ohio and four men were saved in the Richland Correctional Institution there. Also, RiCI approved my application for Chaplain Volunteer while I was there!

While in California I got to witness major 1%er motorcycle club funeral procession, with close to 200 motorcycles. It went right by the church I was preaching at in San Pedro. I was almost surprised at the emotions stirred within me as I watched these men honor their deceased brother. It brought back bittersweet memories of the dozens and dozens of processions I rode in exactly like that, oblivious to the reality of eternity without Jesus Christ. As I watched Harley after Harley roar by, I was reminded how good it is to know what lies beyond the grave for me now.

Again, as in the July letter, I would like to mention Missionary to Mongolia, Craig Fitzgerald, for your consideration. He is a Pensacola Bible Institute graduate, and has been on the field faithfully for 22 years. He has a wife and 3 kids, and has only been back to the states once, for six months, in that time. As missionaries come off the field for whatever reason, and new ones make the rounds on deputation, sometimes those who have been at it a long time get forgotten. Remember those "out of sight, out of mind" and "the squeaky wheel gets the grease" adages? Seems to apply to missionaries, too.
